- **Sports:** Lace 'em up. Compete in or watch your favourite sports event. Whether that's the Canadian Birkebeiner Ski Festival or the Dragon Boat Festival, there's something for everyone.
- **Cultural:** Edmonton's cultural diversity is on display at the multicultural Heritage Festival, colourful Cariwest, the Canadian Finals Rodeo and at powwows that celebrate our Western Canadian roots.
